LONDON, May 2.

INVASION, &c.

Extract of a letter from Teyssie, dated April 27, 1861.

We have rejoiced in the late successes of Great Britain, but we are apprehensive that the different parts of the French coast, both with regard to the apparent detection of her allies, and the perilous situation of her countrymen in Egypt, will render Bonaparte so despondent as to adventure some desperate attempt against the interests of Great Britain. Having vanquished his vicinities on the continent he must turn the whole force of mind and body of the Republic against England. All marines which do not tend to the immediate gratification of his moribund ambition are unworthy of his notice; because delay after such a career of victory and success would endanger his power. He is actuated by great and noble feelings, and is sustained by an immense military force, which must be actively employed abroad in order to secure his possession of power at home. With the death of these two operations on our frontier, it is no wonder that we are now kept constantly on the alert.

Every information from France more and more confirms the hostile intention of the enemy against these islands. Government being at a very considerable expense have the very best intelligence from those employed on the coast of France. By a gentleman just arrived, we learned that M. Hamberg, who commanded the expedition to Ireland, is now at St. Maloes, where he has resided more than a month, to make, by order of the first Consul, the necessary arrangements for another expedition; but whether against England or Ireland, we have not yet been able to ascertain. Troops were hourly expected at St. Maloes from Rome. Several frigates were which lately slipped out of Brest were at St. Maloes, at which place there are 75 gun boats, and such variety of flat-bottomed boats as were capable of accommodating nearly 30,000 men, with 500 artillery, &c. &c. Recollecting the late observations of Bonaparte, that he would, when necessitated, look upon these islands as stepping-stones to England, we begin, I assure you, to confide less in our unfortunate approximation to France. Since the late rumours we learn that the troops expected have arrived at St. Maloes; that the army which Bonaparte had consigned very much increased; and that, knowing the immediate object was a descent on these islands, our apprehensions, but not our fears, have also multiplied with our critical conjunctures.

Extract of a letter from Guarnery, dated April 28.

I have been an English captain that lately fell in a cartel, who affirms that by information that he has obtained upon these three great armies all the enemy's coast, amounting in all to 150,000 men; that there will be augmented to at least 100,000 more; and that their grand object was the invasion of England and Ireland by attempting at all hazards, descents in a variety of places, to secure the effect of Rome. This mode of attack is certainly remarkable, and should not detract, the vigilance of our fleets and armies; and the enemy flattered itself that the landing and co-operation of 100,000 men would force their way to the capital. Arrangements were being making at Brest on the 20th ult. for the accommodation of 30,000 men on their march thither, where the first Consul was daily expected to review them, previous to their grand expedition. The expedition they will be embarked in the neighbourhood of At-Heve, 30,000 men are to be embarked, 40,000 more at St. Maloes; and 20,000 at Granville—making in this quarter in total, 150,000 men. Should the news from Egypt be detrimental to the interests of France, Bonaparte will be obliged to make some extraordinary exertions to appease the people and confirm his supreme authority.

LONDON, May 6.

A letter from Welch, April 25, says, that the Prussian troops have taken possession of Bremen, as well as of the different parts of the Electorate of Hanover which are situated in the North Sea. The months of the Elbe, the Weiser, and the Elms, are shut. Besides that small Russian garrison are posted at equal distances on the coast.

Several regiments of cavalry and infantry have already arrived from the interior of Prussia in Hanover, and we expect more troops. The fort of Hainlich, which is considered as the key of the Electorate of Hanover, has at present a considerable Prussian garrison. On the other side, we continue to fear magazines of provisions at Minden and Ham, for the troops who arrive daily from Brandenburg and Silesia, as well as for those expected from Pomerania.

The Egyptian Frigate of the 13th info has infested a letter, dated Havel, the 6th, which states, that 4 letters from Toulon announce, that the Squadron commanded by Admiral Gauthier, sailed on the 5th Floreal (April 25) with 4000 troops for Egypt?

Gauthier certainly sailed from Toulon for Egypt on the 25th ult., but as Lord Keith has been reinforced to 18 ships of the line, the British Squadron, under Lord Barfote Warren's command, there is little fear of the enemy, whose force consists scarcely of half that number, being unable to reach their destined port. The Egyptian Frigate which we are informed, that the Danae still keep possession of the city, though they no longer militate on this mark per diem—Private letters say, that Denmark demands that the British Frigate should evacuate Havel, over the face time that the withdrawal from Hainburg.

The dispatches yesterday from Lord Elphinstone, that in consequence of Lord Keith's having departed from the command of the victory gained by the English, his Excellency began his march towards Cairo on the 29th of March, with fifteen thousand men.

Extract of a letter from an officer of which is Sir Ralph Abercromby's army, dated Camp near Alexandria, March 16, 1861.

The lake of Aboukir or Mandia is navigable in all its length; it is a basin formed within the few years by an irruption of the sea; at present it is covered with a mass of mud, and in consequence of every thing that is thrown and which could not have well been conveyed by any other means.

The enemy feels undecided in his motions, and I do not know how to interpret his force so much as to offer no well defined resistance. The Fleet moved from Jaffa on the 23d of February and we hear that he advanced guard of maulsukes has advanced to Jaffa. According to our learned Damourah last night, which is about 1500 horse; but we are certain that even if his whole was assembled, we out number him 15 to 1; assure you, our people are ready as they wish to do, and have the most confident for the French, especially for their cavalry. In this all here are unanimous—regiments of all kinds collected and in an open trench, with good bombarding distance, I think Alexandria will not hold long.

A British corvette, consisting of a transport ship with troops, twenty merchant vessels, and eight Portuguese ships, failed from Gibraltar on the 26th of March, under the protection of a frigate and a brig, British ships, which met a Portuguese corvette. They held their course portward. Advice is received that rear Admiral Topham has joined Sir Hyde Parker's Squadron with five sail of the line.

VIENNA, May 6.

It is this day reported, that another corvette had arrived at Lord Minto's from Constantinople, with intelligence that the French army in Egypt had capitulated, and would be conveyed to Frejus, in France, without arms, on board English ships. In how far this report is true, is not known; as no private letters from Constantinople take us notice of this event.

PARIS, May 1.

A letter from Rome, dated April 13, says, that the French have marched 16,000 men into that part of the Kingdom of Naples, which borders on the Gulf of Tarento, as agreed in a particular article of the treaty of peace; the French troops have consequently received orders to cross

state. Termi, Ruoti, Spoleto, not to enter the Kingdom of Naples, or across Calabria.

SEMLIN, April 8.

The report that the fort of Kladowa, a short distance from Berlin, had been taken by the King's army of the Prussia of Belgium is now confirmed. These troops, after having burned the suburbs, penetrated during the night into the fort, the inhabitants of which opened its gates, so that they might be massacred, the garrison of Palslaw Oelow.

LOWER ELBE, May 1.

Yesterday, in a conference held at the Danish head-quarters near Hainburg, where his Highness, Field-Marshal Prince Gustave of Hesse, the Prussian King, Mr. Schultz, and his Excellency Sir Jan Craaford, the British minister, an agreement was entered into, that the Elbe shall be again open to all flags without exception; but the English ships from Altona and Gluckstadt, and the sailing from the Danish harbours on the Elbe, laden with certain provisions from Norway, are to be provided with English flags.

MUNICH, April 19.

Letter from general Moskat, to the Archduke Charles, May 25.

I have the honor to announce to your highness, that, agreeably to the treaty of Lunauville, I have received orders to evaluate the hereditary estates of Austria on the 15th and 10th of May. I also learn, that, by the 19th article of that treaty, the troops of his majesty the Emperor are, by the 5th of April, to return upon his Majesty's territory, under your highness's orders; therefore, I shall return the protection of the different states to the troops of the said states to which they belong, or to the military authorities. Concerning the more particularly arguments for the movement of the troops, I shall expect your royal highness's answer at Munich.

I am much surprised that I have not seen the bill of allowance of various articles of health. It is what, from the report I have long had for your highness, I most sincerely desire.

THE ARCHDUKE'S ANSWER, Vienna, March 28.

General, I have received your letter announcing the evacuation of the hereditary dominions of Austria by the French troops, and other dispositions relative to that event. I shall, in consequence, give the necessary orders to the Austrian troops to the contrary. In regard to the troops in the Upper States, I shall inform the Swabian troops of your arrangements that they may, in concert with you, to regulate their march, as well as those of the French, as far as they will have quitted them. In regard to the other troops of the Empire—their general, the prince of Reau, will, in like manner, concert measures with the French army, which he has appointed to meet to enter after you into Brannau, Kuffstein and Seharmitz, and to take possession of them agreeably to the convention of Steyer. I much regret, General, that circumstances oblige you to leave this country before I can give it in my power to be, and become personally acquainted with you, which I have long desired, that I might assure you of my sincere and particular regard for you.

TURIN, April 9.

In consequence of a decree of the councils of the French Republic, dated April 1, Piedmont will now form a military division, which will be divided into six subdivisions, and they will form a many provinces. These provinces will be under the inspection of an Administrator General, who will have nearly the same authority in Piedmont, as was possessed by the Commissary of government formerly called the Agent for the United Department. The organization of the civil judiciary order will be regulated according to the mode prescribed by the law of the 17th of March 1800. The criminal court of justice will be composed of special tribunals and extraordinary military commissions. The police will be conducted according to the methods established by the law of the 17th of March 1800, and that of the 26th January 1801. A division of the army will also be stationed in Piedmont. The financial regulations are only of a temporary nature, and the sale of the national domains has been suspended.
